
Unprecedented Times call for Unprecedented Parenting

"I thank God ... for parents who are serious about their commitment to <u>righteous</u>, intentional parenting."







Intentional Parenting

Encourage Growth

- Pray for guidance. Heavenly Father knows your children and will help you teach them.
- Help your children seek and recognize the influence of the Holy Ghost.
- Express love and frequently compliment your children in their efforts to do well and for the Christlike qualities you see in them.
- Look for opportunities to serve others as a family.


Provide Guidance

- Help your children see how they can apply the gospel in all areas of their lives.
- Guide your children and encourage them to set their own goals and plans.
- Help them come up with their own solutions to problems.
- Offer support, help, and encouragement along the way.

• Talk with Leaders

• Communicate with teachers and leaders to determine how they can best support your children. Be careful not to break any confidences with your children or embarrass them.

Three Practices for Intentional Parenting



 Cocooning: Protecting your children
Pre-arming: Preparing your children for danger
Deference: Respecting your children's agency

1. Cocooning: *Protecting your children*

- In this method, parents protect their children from anything that poses a potential threat.
- Cocooning is common during early childhood and may include forbidding certain television shows or avoiding potentially dangerous activities. By doing this, parents teach children right from wrong.





2. Pre-arming: *Preparing your children for danger*

- This means that parents provide guidance, coaching, and instruction to their children to help them know how to respond to potentially harmful situations.
- For example, parents may ask a child to practice exact dialogue that could be used if a peer were to offer the child a dangerous substance. Or, parents may ask a child to share specific actions that could be taken to steer away from damaging situations.
- This method allows parents to teach why something is right or wrong and becomes more effective as children mature. Pre-arming conversations might teach:
 - Healthy sexuality and intimacy.
 - Responsible media use, including safeguards against pornography.
 - Modesty and other standards from For the Strength of Youth.

3. Deference: *Respecting your children's agency*

- This method allows children to make their own decisions as they practice choosing between right and wrong.
- Deference demonstrates great trust in a child. Because of the complexities in granting a child sufficient responsibility to make decisions, deference requires that a child have adequate maturity to understand the consequences of decisions.
- Deference works well with adolescent or older children after parents have employed strategies like pre-arming and cocooning for several years.



Protection Them from the World

When the Savior called His disciples, He used a similar pattern. First, He showed them the importance of shunning the world.



Teach them their Role

Then, through discussion and example, He taught them why His ways were best:

"Verily, verily, I say unto you, this is my gospel; and ye know the things that ye must do in my church; for the works which ye have seen me do that shall ye also do; for that which ye have seen me do even that shall ye do; Therefore, if ye do these things blessed are ye, for ye shall be lifted up at the last day." (3 Nephi 27:21–22).

Leaving them alone

Finally, He left their presence and allowed them, with guidance from the Holy Ghost, to use what they had learned to lead the Church and preach the gospel.

"Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send him unto you. And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: Of sin, because they believe not on me; Of righteousness, because I go to my Father, and ye see me no more; Of judgment, because the prince of this world is judged. I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now. Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come." (John 16:7–13)


